



NDUTU WILDERNESS CAMP TANZANIA

Welcome to Nduku Wilderness Camp

This intimate, comfortable tented camp is available in the Nduku area of the Serengeti ecosystem typically from December—March, which coincides with the 'calving season'. It is placed in a private site, in the heart of the Nduku plains - nestled under shady trees.

The camp comprises of just ten spacious tents, all with solar lighting and en suite facilities (eco-friendly, flushing toilet and shower). Comfortable beds with quality linen ensure a good night's rest.

Our professional staff will be on hand to look after your every need, and our safari chef will prepare wholesome and varied meals during your stay at the camp. Meals are served in a large dining tent or alfresco. The communal lounge and bar area is a great place to relax in the cool evenings.



About the area

Plenty of predators can be found year round in this area: Lion, Cheetah, Leopard, Serval, African Wildcat, Caracal as well as Hyena and many other smaller species - some easier to spot than others! The diverse eco-systems, from woodlands, to plains, to soda lakes, within the Nduku area make it a unique place for bird watching.

The Nduku area is the best place to be to witness the annual wildebeest calving spectacle. Once the rains start (usually late November), the huge herds make their way down from the Mara River to graze the short grass plains of the Serengeti. For up to five months of the year the wildebeest remain in and around this area, making it an excellent base from which to explore.

Your safari experience

Aside from game drives in the Serengeti, we also recommend a visit to Olduvai Gorge or the Ngorongoro Crater. Game walks may be undertaken in the area with local Conservation Rangers, Masaai, and our qualified guides. We can also take you to various villages for community interaction and to find out more about the local Maasai culture. You may like to support local community projects (such as building of schools, health centres, planting trees, etc).

Walking safaris

We have designed some fantastic multiple day walking safaris in the Ngorongoro Conservation area, partially backed up by vehicle and/or donkeys. These safaris take you from the plains of the Nduvu region, up to the highlands of Ngorongoro and Empakaai. For those very adventurous souls we can organise a hike up Ol Donyo Lengai (only for seasoned hikers), and enjoy nearby Lake Natron.

When to go

This camp is in Nduvu area seasonally, i.e. between December and March annually, and can be booked in conjunction with a stay in Serengeti Wilderness Camp (central) or a safari to nearby Ngorongoro/Tarangire or Lake Manyara.

Getting there

- » 6-hour drive from Arusha
- » Direct internal flights from Kilimanjaro/Arusha to Nduvu airstrip, about a 10 minute drive from camp

Community projects

We have refurbished a school at Misigiyo where water, solar lighting and a library were developed.
